Money Matters	 Cash and Traveler's Checks Bring enough traveler's checks and/or cash to cover your first few weeks in Japan and be sure to exchange them to Japanese Yen <u>before arriving in Akita</u>. It will take a few weeks to open a bank account and receive international wire transfers. Credit Cards You are strongly recommended to bring a valid credit card with you to Japan (Visa, MasterCard, Diner's Club, American Express). Many major banks, hotels, restaurants, etc. accept credit cards, but the majority of local retailers, restaurants, etc. do not accept credit cards. Verify that your contract between you and your credit card company allows you to use your card in Japan before coming.

GPA Requirement	Applicants must have completed two semesters at an AIU partner institution before applying and have a cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average) of 2.50 (4.0 scale) or higher .
Level of English Proficiency Requirement	Applicants whose first language is NOT English are required to achieve a standard of TOEFL ® Test score 61 (iBT) or its equivalent, or IELTS score of 5.0 or equivalent. The Center for International Affairs will submit the application for the CoE to the immigration office in order that admitted students can arrive on AIU campus by our official arrival day.
